Using Diversity Codes for a Retrospective Assessment of an Academic Library Collection

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Purpose

Evaluate current monograph collection through a diversity lens in order to ascertain what percentage reflects something other than the experiences of white, heteronormative, non-disabled males.

Scope

Broad → Shallow

OR

Focused → Deep

Scale down → random sample, defined date or classification range, subset of titles, etc.

Themes:

- Race
- Ethnicity
- Immigration
- Gender
- Sexual Identity
- Socioeconomic Status
- Ability
- General/Multidisciplinary (i.e. diversity, multiculturalism, intersectionality, social justice)

Not included in this assessment:

- Age
- #ownvoices
- Political Diversity
- Religious Diversity
- Veteran Status

Methodology

Assign diversity codes to list of FY20 (n = 806) and FY21 (n = 794) acquisitions to demonstrate intentionality (or not) of collecting diverse materials.

Use title, TOC, summary, and/or subject headings to determine whether the book/title reflects a measure of diversity

Considerations & Limitations

- No single method is "right" or comprehensive
- Interdisciplinary nature of diversity topics and LC classification scheme
- Subject content and interpretation can be subjective human fallibility in assigning codes
- Inconsistency of code assignments among multiple selectors/evaluators
- Start with a well-defined scope as it might be difficult to anticipate all possible codes/categories needed
- Cumbersome approach for larger collections
- A number alone cannot account for diverse content within a diversity category
 - i.e. not all "Jewish" books should be about the Holocaust
 - i.e. there are multiple subcategories under the "LGBTQ+" umbrella
