# **Supporting Accessible LibGuide Design** through a Large-Scale Review

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### **Project Goals**

- Assist colleagues in reviewing and improving accessibility of LibGuides
- Test rubric as an accessibility evaluation tool
- Provide meaningful **remote** work for two student workers
- Develop students' understanding of accessible design, as it relates to information literacy (Information has Value) and inclusive practice

## Acknowledgements UF Libraries for funding student remote work

#### Method

2 student library workers used a rubric to manually review 69 LibGuides including **600** pages.

#### **Key Findings**

- Hundreds of issues including Alt Text, color contrast, and heading styles Rubric not easily understood
